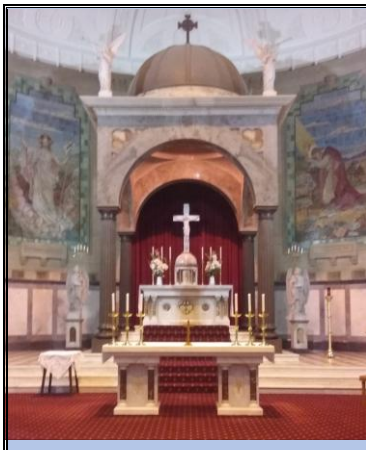

St Margaret’s Church

On the 16th November, 2025, St. Mary’s Parish received the Building Audit & Condition Report on St. Margaret’s Church prepared by Ultum. The Parish Masterplan Reference Group met on 9th December to discuss the Report and determine a response.

The Masterplan Reference Group gave four recommendations:

- that in line with the community feedback (through the survey regarding investment priorities related to the Masterplan): the Presbytery and community space were identified as top priorities.
- that in order to manage expenditure the Parish community exit the property (St. Margaret’s) by November 2026.
- that the property be demolished and the land be sold.
- that a communication strategy be developed to inform the community of this outcome.

I have largely accepted these recommendations. Although further discussions are to be held concerning the timeline as well as what may occur with the land. I intend to provide more information in the coming week or two, covering structural, safety, and financial issues and the requirements of the Archdiocese. The decision to move towards the close of St. Margaret’s Church is most significant in the history of St. Mary’s Parish. In an ideal world this would not take place. In my view, ideally, the parish would want to see a new church replacing the existing one. There is much to acknowledge about the history of St. Margaret’s Church and the experience of parishioners. The reason for the expansion of our parish there was “to provide for the increasing number of Catholics in Maribyrnong.” Apparently, it was a “long felt desire” of Father Bakker to establish a Catholic presence there. “A few years ago Catholic families in this district could be counted on the fingers of both hands.” “Others have since come to Maribyrnong.”

When Father Bakker needed a place for the celebration of Mass in Maribyrnong the Council placed the local hall at his disposal. “For some time the Catholic people at Maribyrnong, which is part of the Ascot Vale parish, have attended Mass on Sundays at the district hall.

The need for better provision has been met by the setting up of St. Margaret's Church on a prominent site in Maribyrnong. The Church was formerly the chapel for the Catholic troops at the Broadmeadows Camp. It was purchased by Very Rev. H. Bakker PP for £500. It's re-erection and equipment and the site cost £4875, and the present debt is £2225.

Father Catarinich said there were forty Catholic families at Maribyrnong and they were remarkably generous. Functions held in the district in aid of church funds have been well patronised by Catholics and non Catholics and £2650 of the debt had already been paid. There had been difficulties in connection with religious celebrations in the past, but these had now been overcome by the erection of St Margaret's Church. Pontifical Benediction was given by Archbishop Mannix, assisted by Fathers Bakker, Catarinich and Rafter. St Mary's Girls' Choir, Ascot Vale, sang the hymns.

A dynamic thought faithful to the Gospel

Brief summary The Social Doctrine of the Church (SDC) is not a "static set of concepts," but a dynamic thought that evolves in dialogue with history. It arises from the Church's mission to walk with humanity, respecting the autonomy of civil entities but offering the Gospel as a criterion of justice. Historical Evolution: From Pope Leo XIII's defence of workers (Rerum Novarum) to Pius XI's principle of subsidiarity, up to the global attention of Saint John XXIII. The turning point of the Second Vatican Council: It proposes the method of listening to the "signs of the times," making dialogue with the human sciences an integral part of the Church's mission. Recent Magisterium: Saint John Paul II emphasizes the dignity of work, Benedict XVI emphasizes charity in truth, and Pope Francis emphasizes fraternity and integral ecology, combining care for our common home and the preferential option for the poor. The digital world and Artificial Intelligence (AI) are realities that require further evolution of the SDC.

Quotations from the Encyclical

Artificial intelligence should not be considered as merely yet another theme to be studied or an emergency to be managed, but rather as a development that challenges the categories of Social Doctrine from within, entailing its further development in fidelity to the Gospel. History is thus understood as one of the places in which the Church allows herself to be taught by the Spirit about the humanizing power of the Gospel; and she learns to develop her own teaching at the service of the dignity of every person and the good of all peoples. The Church's Social Doctrine is born from the encounter between the eternal truth of the Gospel and the questions of history.
