We all need a place of refreshment for our weary souls

One of the most welcome sights in a harsh desert is an oasis. In the ancient world it was a major stop on any trade route where people could pause, refresh themselves, and replenish their water supply for the journey ahead. As well as soothing our physical weariness, in today's demanding world people are becoming increasingly weary in soul.

The Lord invites all of us to come to him: *Come to me all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest.* This is the spiritual oasis we need and it is grounded in prayer; crucial for the Christian life, and the place where we can try to see life around us through the perspective of God's sight.

Too often we identify prayer with simply "saying prayers" and extensive devotions and spiritual practices may even weary us more. Prayer is not a one size fits all activity. If our prayer life is to be a true spiritual oasis, it should be a place where we can draw strength from the gift of Christ's grace. Ultimately it is our relationship with Christ that we seek to nourish. Any forms of prayer that enable us to do that should be followed. Daily Mass, meditation, adoration and other simple devotions may become our way of finding rest for our souls.

In the process we must be gentle and balanced, taking things slowly and not inflicting spiritual overload or burnout on ourselves! We can be confident that Christ will give us the refreshment and peace we need for the rest of our journey.
