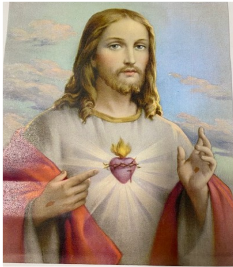

We are called to courageous confession

Jesus says, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Hell." These words of Jesus have often been described as **the call to courageous confession**.

Physical persecution is frightening and the early Church suffered. It has been a feature of the Church's life through the centuries and is happening today, particularly in Africa. But there is another kind of persecution going on that will never hurt a hair of our head but **it can destroy our soul**. This sort of persecution undermines our trust in others, our faith, our commitment to truth and honesty and our sense of generosity and responsibility for others. Ultimately it can destroy our values, our hopes, our following of Christ.

These modern day persecutions will never bruise the body. They don't use instruments of torture. They are under the guise of attitudes and behaviours in our society which can eat away at everything we consider sacred and holy (movies, music, jokes, novels and so on). It all sounds rather bleak and depressing, but as St Paul reminds us, **we are not without hope** because into this sinful world the grace of Jesus Christ has come to each of us.

We are given this power to resist sin with the help of God's grace. God has an eye on each one of us and he gives each of us the grace we uniquely need in the dangers to faith that we face. Like those Apostles in the early Church, we can be people of courageous confession in the Church today if we allow God's grace to light up our lives too.
