BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

STAY AWAKE!

Happy New Year! Today we listen to the Gospel according to Matthew for the first time on this first day of the new liturgical year, Year A. Matthew writes for Jewish followers of Jesus living in the mid-80s of the first century. We shall listen to this Gospel aware that Israelite-Jewish concepts permeate its presentation of the Jewish Jesus, so different from Mark or Luke.

The language of today's Gospel is very Jewish. It is drawn from imagery of the Old Testament—typical, as we shall see, of Matthew—and from a particular style of biblical writing called 'apocalyptic'. Tempted to take our selection literally, it is better and to think of it as 'theological-poetry'. The evangelist uses a familiar Jewish literary style of writing. Its basic theme is that, despite the evil and tragedies that surround people, God will save and protect those who are faithful, especially at that definitive moment of divine judgement at the end of time.

Jesus' injunction is to 'stay awake' to this moment—not to fall asleep or become disheartened by its delay. God will definitively act against evil and vindicate the faithful. Today's Gospel is a sobering reminder. We, too, must 'stay awake' and 'stand ready' to what will unfold in the year ahead and not be dispirited by all that seems negative, fruitless and disheartening. God's presence, the God who 'will be with us' will be revealed in the figure of the 'Son of Man'. This is a recurring theme in the Gospel and throughout this new liturgical year.

Words from the desk of the PP:

Advent 2025: Year A: This week we begin our journey towards Christmas, towards once again celebrating the wonderful truth that God has come among us. Jesus Christ comes to be with us so that we can know God's love and be welcomed into the Father's loving embrace.

With the start of Advent we finish our journey with the Gospel of Luke and enter a journey with the Gospel of Matthew. We move back to the beginning of our three-year cycle (Yr A Matthew, Yr B Mark, Yr C Luke, with John presented largely during the Easter season).

We go through this cycle of the Gospels so that we can intentionally approach our understanding of Jesus Christ from different perspectives. This coming year, with the Gospel of Matthew speaking to a mixed community of Jesus and Gentiles, we see Jesus through the lens of God being in control of salvation. Matthew shows us that the trajectory of history leads inevitably from our separation from God (the Fall told of in Genesis) to our access to God's love through Jesus Christ himself. Stay tuned, listen closely as the year progresses.

ACYF!!! Australian Catholic Youth Festival: The festival starts this Sunday and this Sunday at the St Greg's 10:30 am Mass, we will bless and commission our pilgrims and leaders from both St Kevin's and St Greg's. These three days are an opportunity for the pilgrims to grow in faith, in developing their personal relationship with Jesus Christ and in understanding the call of the Holy Spirit. Let us stand with them in our prayers.

Budget 2026: We are in the process of developing our budget for 2026. If you have ideas about things that we should be or could be doing but that might cost a few dollars, please let me know, or send us an email and we can consider what budget allowance can be made. Our budget is healthy but needs careful management. Which means we can't do everything at once but can make room for things that can grow our capacity as disciples who are faithful and welcoming and seek to go and make disciples.

Repair of Leaks: Just about done ... finishing works this coming week, if weather permits. During recent rains, I have observed both areas where leaks have been present and both seem to be fixed: no sign of water in the places I would expect. Time will tell but I think the leaks have been resolved.

<u>Toilets: use of paper towels</u>: I am sensitive to the different needs of people and so am hesitant to raise this matter but every Sunday morning, there would appear to be a single individual who feels compelled to make excessive use of paper hand towels. This person empties one or more toilets of all towels leaving a mess and meaning subsequent users are deprived of the option to use towels rather than the air-dryer.

I can think of three reasons for this behaviour: some sort of compulsion / mental illness, thinking it's fun or being deliberately nasty to others.

Please, whoever is causing this issue: if it's 'fun' or being nasty: stop! If it's some compulsion: seek help. Come and see me and maybe I can point you to where to seek advice/assistance.
