FIRST READING

Ezek 47: 1-2, 8-9, 12

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I saw water flowing from the temple and all who
were touched by it were saved.

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. The man went to the east holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he made me wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across the stream again; the water reached my knees. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand; it was now a river which I could not cross; the stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said, 'Do you see, son of man?' He took me further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. When I got back, there were many trees on each bank of the river. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails, they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from



the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

SACRED SPACE

November: All Souls: Thank you to all those who joined me in blessing the graves of those we love at Templestowe and Eltham Cemeteries as part of our commemoration of the souls of all the faithful departed.

ACYF!!! Australian Catholic Youth Festival: Apparently bookings are full: over 6000 pilgrims from across Australia will attend. An amazing irruption of the Holy Spirit is anticipated. There is much work going on to prepare for the event to ensure a safe and spiritual experience so we keep the pilgrims and organisers in our prayers. And thank you to the additional donors who have added an extra \$1500 to the kitty. We will use the money wisely. Thank you!

Opportunities coming up:

There are numerous things on the horizon for our parishes.

We have been piloting a way of walking in discipleship with young people. A man in the US, Everett Fritz, started Andrew Ministries as a means of helping show parishes a different way of helping our young people grow into their faith. Small groups with mature people to guide them. A gathering of 5 or so young people with two leasers – each week for maybe 2 hours, from age 13 or so – to help the young people ask the questions and seek the answers THEY need.

We are looking to pilot fellowship groups over the Christmas / New Year. Groups of people gathered together for a meal, faith discussion, fellowship, sharing of challenges and joys, friendship building. We don't have a name for this, though many others do something along these lines and call them Faith Circles, or Connect Groups, and many other things.

Possibilities for faith formation / bible study / prayer groups / devotionals / adoration, lectio divina ... all sorts of things are possible.

Please let me know, your PPC members know what you need for your faith to be nourished and grow and spread.

Repair of Leaks: The leak above the tabernacle has been repaired. Time will tell if the repair is 100% effective but I am very hopeful. Rain delayed the repairs of the leak around the window by the organ: but ... next Monday.

Columbarium: We are approaching the end of the approvals process for the Columbarium. A few remaining questions to answer. Pictures of the Columbarium are posted in the Gathering Space for you to look at and see what is planned. Please have a look and give us your thoughts and comments. The drawings are as close as we can get to the 'real thing' but the big difference is that the bricks for the wall will match those of the existing church walls.

Assuming final approvals are obtained, we will seek approvals from the Archdiocese and continue seeking ways to ensure that the cost is as low as possible for achieving construction of an excellent Columbarium. We will end up with a discrete, private space effectively invisible from the road and surrounds: a space that will house the cremated remains of parishioners and their families over coming decades. We have 19 expressions of interest for 40 niches, a good start. People will usually purchase a space well ahead of need. I don't anticipate that there will be more than 5 interments per year based on current funeral numbers (there will be ups and downs in numbers over the years). This means that we will have time to ease into this new feature of expressing our faith.
