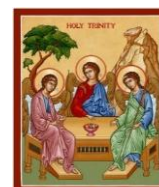

The Living Word

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

30 August 2026

First Reading Jer 20:7-9

The word of the Lord God has meant derision for me.

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced;
you have overpowered me: you were the stronger.

I am a daily laughing-stock,
everybody's butt.

Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!'

The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long.

I used to say, I will not think about him,
I will not speak in his name any more.

Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart,

imprisoned in my bones.

The effort to restrain it wearied me,
I could not bear it.

Responsorial Psalm

O Lord my God.*

Second Reading Rom 12:1-2

May you present your bodies as a living sacrifice.

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled

by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Gospel Mt 16:21-27

Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

We have to get one terrible thought out of our heads, i.e. that the Heavenly Father of Jesus wanted him to suffer a tortured, agonising death. Yet we do say: 'It was necessary that Jesus suffer and die.' What can this mean? I believe this refers to the necessity of divine mission and the necessity of divine love.

First, it was the Father's will that Jesus remain true to the mission to preach and embody the gospel of mercy and forgiveness. It was inevitable that powerful elites would find this intolerable and have Jesus eliminated. Secondly, God so loved the world where death ravages human beings, that God determined to absorb the suffering and pangs of death.

The temptation to avoid that dreadful necessity lead Jesus to rebuke Peter: 'Get behind me, Satan', a terrible variation of the initial call: 'Come, follow me.'

We could pause for a moment to very consciously make the sign of the Cross, the consequence of Jesus' mission and love for us.

ST ELIZABETH HOSPITAL SUPPORT GROUP

Fr John has invited Fr Robert to visit our parish community with the intention that we will join in the support of his work in Pakistan, making this an outreach project to a community in need by the Parishes of the Macedon Ranges. Fr Robert McCulloch will be speaking at the Masses in Woodend, Lancefield and Romsey next weekend about St Elizabeth Support Group. St Elizabeth Hospital is in Hyderabad Pakistan and has been helped by the St Elizabeth Support Group which was began by parishioners in Gisborne, Macedon and Riddells Creek in 2015 to equip the hospital as it serves people in great need. St Elizabeth is a 100-bed hospital with a speciality in Mother and Childcare and has a mobile medical outreach which provides free primary care to over 50,000 impoverished people in rural settlements every year. It provides free home-based palliative care nursing to 35 terminally ill cancer patients and has the only palliative care day centre in Pakistan. Fr Robert McCulloch is a Columban missionary priest from Melbourne. He has worked in Pakistan since 1978 and has been connected with St Elizabeth Hospital since 2001. He is the chairman of the hospital's Board. He will return to Pakistan on September 6.

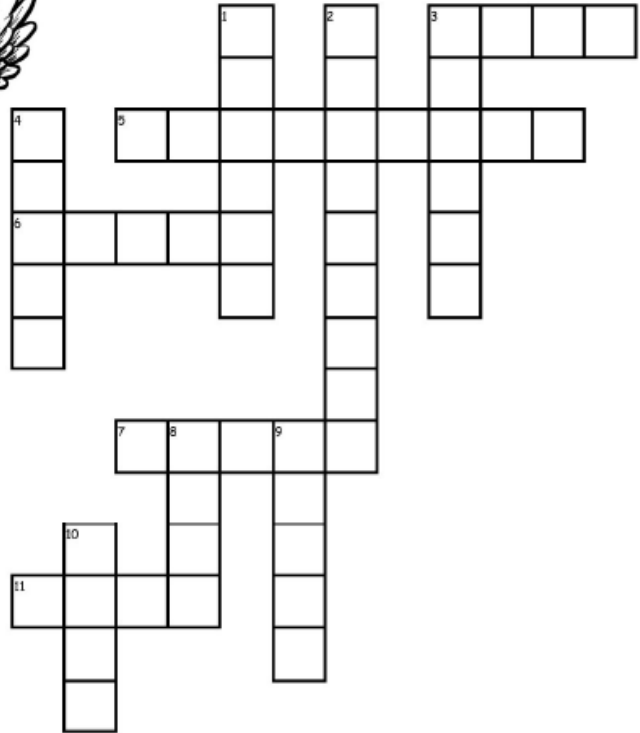
