RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (now often referred to as OCIA, Order of Christian Initiation of Adults).

It is the step-by-step process used by the Catholic Church to welcome and prepare adults who wish to enter the Catholic faith

Liturgy Notice

The ringing of a bell derives from Christian tradition, which "summoned the people into common worship." (The Book of Blessings.)

- At the start of the Mass, at the sound of the bell, the congregation should stand and without prompting, pray together the **Entrance Antiphon**.
- Similarly, for the Communion Antiphon, a bell is rung when the priest drinks from the chalice then without prompting, all pray the **Communion Antiphon**.
- With regard to the Gospel Acclamation, *as there will be no ringing of the bell*, the reader will leave the lectern, walk down the steps and turn to bow to the altar; then the congregation stands and recites without prompting, the **Gospel Acclamation** (Alleluia verse).

Pope Leo appoints Archbishop Comensoli to Dicastery for Evangelisation

Pope Leo XIV has appointed Archbishop Peter A Comensoli to the Dicastery for Evangelisation, Section for Fundamental Questions regarding Evangelisation in the World. Archbishop Comensoli was appointed a member of the dicastery together with Archbishop Filippo Iannone O Carm (Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops) and Archbishop Èric de Moulins-Beaufort of Reims, France. The appointment was announced on Saturday 27 June.

'I thank the Holy Father for the trust he has placed in me with this appointment, and I commit to working diligently for the evangelising mission of the Church,' said Archbishop Comensoli. In accepting his new appointment, Archbishop Comensoli asked the community to keep him in their prayers. 'I humbly ask for your prayers for this appointment. And may each of us renew our commitment to share the hope of the Gospel with all we meet.'

The appointment is in addition to his responsibilities as the Archbishop of Melbourne.

The ministry’s work is vast and includes providing support, pastoral and spiritual care to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, educating the wider community and working towards achieving real and lasting reconciliation. Inspired by the Gospel, ACM is committed to the dignity of each person, to open hospitality, to truth-telling about dispossession, to be a place of connection—working for reconciliation in partnership with those who believe that there can be an alternative to the present order. 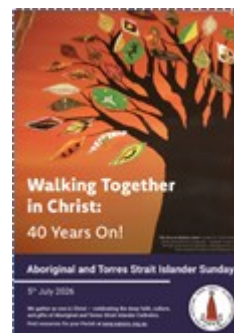

On the first Sunday of July each year, the Catholic Church in Australia celebrates Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday. On this day we gather as one to honour and celebrate the rich cultural heritage, spirituality and contributions our First Nations Peoples make the life of the Church.

The theme for this year's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday is 'Walking together in Christ: 40 years on!' and the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) has produced resources to assist parishes in their celebration of this important day.

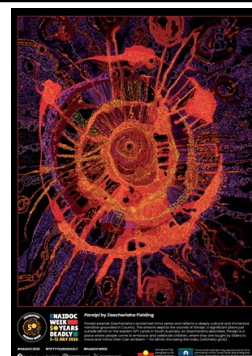

Each theme has marked a moment in time, capturing where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples were, and where the country needs to pay attention.



50 Years of Deadly is both a reflection and a declaration.

It acknowledges the strength it has taken to reach this milestone, not by chance, but because generations of people refused to be silenced. It recognises the organisers, artists, activists and communities who carried NAIDOC forward year after year, ensuring it remained grounded in culture and community.
