The Most Holy Body & Blood of Jesus

Our **First Reading** recalls God providing manna to the Israelites in the desert, prefiguring the Eucharist as spiritual food.

In the **Second Reading** St. Paul explains that sharing the blessing-cup and broken bread is a communion in the body and blood of Christ, binding all believers together.

In our **Gospel** Jesus declares "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink," emphasizing that partaking in him brings eternal life.

The feast of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Jesus also known as Corpus Christi highlights the sacramental and sacrificial reality of Christ's presence and invites us into a deeper Eucharistic devotion.

Twelve Promises of Jesus to St Margaret Mary Alacoque



The month of June is devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the

apparitions to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus gives these twelve promises to those who are devoted to His Sacred Heart.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death.
5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
9. I will bless the homes where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the power of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced.
12. The all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour.

Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins I offer you this poor heart of mine.

Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, Good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you. Protect me in the midst of danger. Comfort me in my afflictions.

Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen.

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ, Year A

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday during the Last Supper. He also instructed his disciples saying, “do this in memory of me”. Accordingly, right from the start of Christianity “the Holy Mass” is being celebrated. But only in 1264 the Church included in the Liturgical Calendar the Feast of “Corpus Christi” to honour the Eucharist, now called “the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.”



A feast like this gives us an opportunity to appreciate and thank God for Christ’s abiding presence with us in this Sacrament. It is also an opportunity for us to seek a closer relation with Jesus, present in the Eucharist. Sadly, not everyone believes in the real presence. Even among us who believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, we do so in varying degrees. Some believe in it without any doubting, others believe but with a lot of doubt.

Nearly 1300 years ago, a Basilian monk in Lanciano, Italy, was doubting the real presence of Our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. He used to pray constantly for relief from his doubts. He doubted so much that he wanted to leave his priesthood. But one morning, while he was having a strong attack of doubt, he began the celebration of the Mass for the people of the town. The consecrated bread and wine caused his hands to shake, indeed his whole body. The host had turned into Flesh. The wine had turned into Blood. But that's not all. The miracle is ongoing. The Host-turned-Flesh, and the Wine-turned-Blood, without the use of any form of preservative, is still present in the reliquary. Later a pilgrim priest commended "Remember, this miracle that you are witnessing now, and that you have travelled so far to witness, happens every day in every church in the world, at the consecration of the Mass."



Many tests have been made over the years. The most recent, extensive scientific research done in 1970, used the most modern scientific tools available. The results of the tests are as follows: The flesh is real flesh. The blood is real blood. The flesh consists of the muscular tissue of the heart. The flesh and blood belong to the human species. The flesh and blood have the same blood type (AB+) This is consistent with all other similar miracles.

Let us always approach the Eucharist with a livelier faith, not doubting even a bit.
