Pope's May Prayer Intention: 'That everyone might have food'

Pope Leo XIV has urged Catholics across the
globe to join him this May in praying that
everyone might have food.

He released the monthly "Pray with the Pope"
video on Thursday, which is prepared by the
Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.

In his prayer, the Pope recognized with sorrow
that millions of brothers and sisters continue to
suffer from hunger.

Lamenting that so many goods are wasted at
our tables, Pope Leo prayed that the Lord
may "awaken in us a new awareness: that we
learn to give thanks for every food, to consume
simply, to share with joy, and to care for the
fruits of the earth as a gift from You, destined
for all, not just a few."

He prayed that Jesus makes us capable of
"transforming the logic of selfish consumption
into a culture of solidarity," through our
communities by promoting concrete gestures,
including awareness campaigns, food banks, and
a sober and responsible lifestyle.

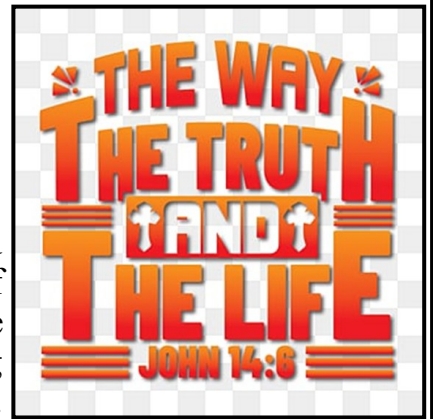
"You who sent us Your beloved Son Jesus, broken
bread for the life of the world," Pope Leo prayed,
"give us a new heart, hungry for justice and
thirsty for fraternity."

Pope Leo concluded by praying, "may no one
be excluded from the common table, and may
Your Spirit teach us to see bread not as an
object of consumption but as a sign of communion
and care. Amen."

In a press release accompanying the video,
Fr. Cristóbal Fones, international director of the
Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, said the
intention is very significant.

"This intention," he said, "comes from the Pope's
heart. It pains him deeply that so many people in
the world cannot access something as essential
and human as food. This is why he is asking
everyone not to remain indifferent but to take
decisive action, first with prayer, then with
concrete gestures of solidarity."

5th Sunday of Easter, Year A Jesus the Way!

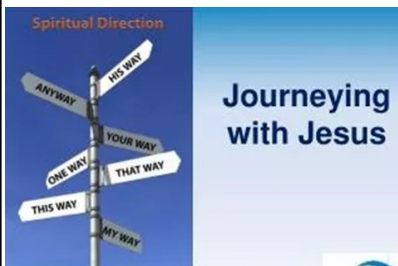


Dear brothers and sisters in the Risen Lord,

One might find it difficult to accept that there is Grace of God outside Catholic Church or outside Christianity; A kind of monopolizing Jesus. The attitude of “Jesus for all” should be our attitude. We are taught that, belief in Jesus and being Baptised are essential for salvation, for He is the only Saviour. The only Truth, the only Way.

It is true, yet we should be broad minded to pray that Jesus may save others too, somehow. Nothing is impossible with God. He is the father of everyone, all are His children. All are precious to Him. May He work miracles in everyone irrespective of their religion.

We gladly say that God is everywhere, in every flower, every bird and so on. But at times we are reluctant to say God is in those who profess another faith. It does not mean that all religions are equal. Or that, it does not matter which religion or denomination one belongs to. Faith in Jesus has a big role in one’s salvation. Our Catholic faith must remain very dear to us. For we believe that the safest means to get to heaven is to belong to Catholic Church and be nourished by the Sacraments and lead good Christian lives.



According to Vatican II we are duty bound to proclaim our faith. Yet we cannot be religious fanatics or narrow minded. The word ‘Catholic’ means Universal. We are to be inclusive in our attitudes towards those belonging to other religions and denominations. Let us pray that, everyone may believe in Jesus as the only Saviour, that soon enough there may be one flock and one shepherd, Jesus Christ.

Pray also that those who do not believe in Jesus may be saved through Him who died for all. The whole world does not know of anyone else other than Jesus, who has paid for our debts. Then how can anyone say that there are ways other than this One Way, whom we call, Jesus? There are many ways; all theses ways have to merge with the One Way leading up to heaven.
