Something to Think About

Today we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent. Advent is a Latin word which means 'coming'. When Advent comes, we know that Christmas is not far away! It is an exciting time as we look forward to the joy of Jesus' birth at Christmas. What do you like most about Christmas?

The Story

Jesus is telling his disciples to be on their guard and to be ready. Jesus promised that he would come back one day, and we need to be ready for him. But how do we get ready? Jesus says that we should always be ready to help others, to forgive, to be kind and friendly. We never know what might happen, so we should be ready to do what God wants.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (24:37-44)

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Son of Man appears, things will be just as they were when Noah lived.

People were eating, drinking, and getting married right up to the day that the flood came and Noah went into the big boat. They didn't know anything was happening until the flood came and swept them all away. That is how it will be when the Son of Man appears.

"Two men will be in the same field, but only one will be taken. The other will be left.

Two women will be together grinding grain, but only one will be taken. The other will be left.

"So be on your guard!

You don't know when your Lord will come.

Homeowners never know when a thief is coming,
and they are always on guard to keep one from breaking in.

Always be ready!

You don't know when the Son of Man will come."

Group Discussion

All: Amen.

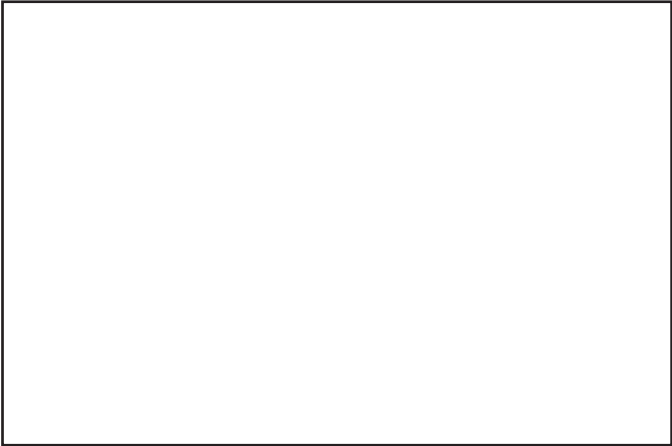
Group Activity (optional)

- Children can take these prayer books home and use them throughout Advent to pray for others.





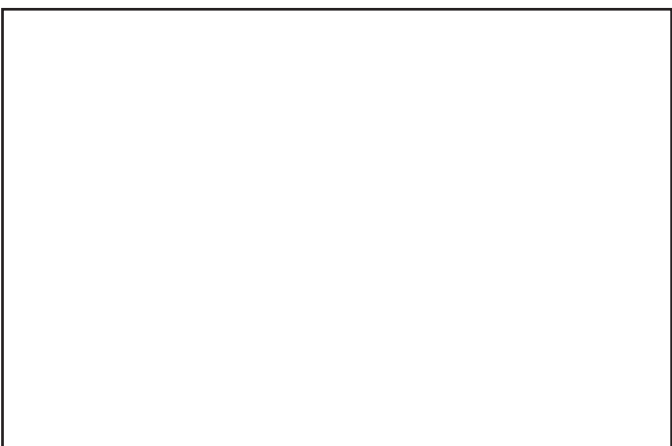

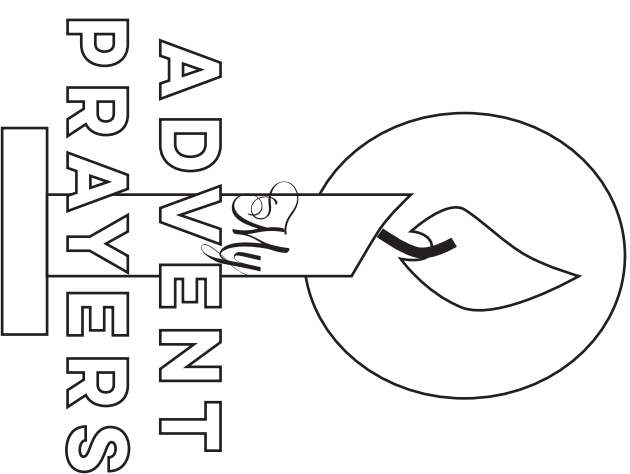

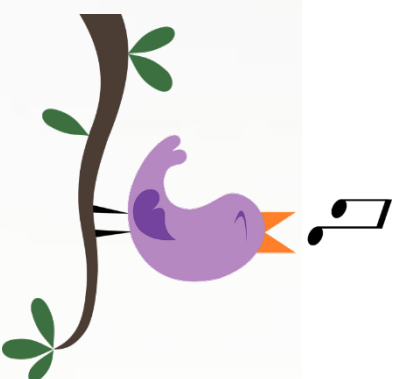
