Reading

First Jeremiah 17:5-8

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

A curse on those who trust in humanity; a blessing on those who trust in the Lord.

The Lord says this:

‘A curse on the man who puts his trust in man, who relies on things of flesh, whose heart turns from the Lord.

He is like dry scrub in the wastelands: if good comes, he has no eyes for it, he settles in the parched places of the wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited. ‘A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord for his hope. He is like a tree by the waterside that thrusts its roots to the stream: when the heat comes it feels no alarm, its foliage stays green; it has no worries in a year of drought, and never ceases to bear fruit.’

If our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are the most unfortunate of all people.

But Christ has in fact been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep.

Gospel

Luke 6:17. 20-26

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Happy are the poor. Woe to the rich!

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stopped at a piece of level ground where there was a large gathering of his disciples with a great crowd of people from all parts of Judaea and from Jerusalem and from the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon who had come to hear him and to be cured of their diseases.

Then fixing his eyes on his disciples he said:

‘How happy are you who are poor: yours is the kingdom of God.

Happy you who are hungry now: you shall be satisfied.

Happy you who weep now: you shall laugh.

‘Happy are you when people hate you, drive you out, abuse you, denounce your name as criminal, on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice when that day comes and dance for joy, for then your reward will be great in heaven. This was the way their ancestors treated the prophets.

‘But alas for you who are rich: you are having your consolation now.

Alas for you who have your fill now: you shall go hungry.

Alas for you who laugh now: you shall mourn and weep.

‘Alas for you when the world speaks well of you! This was the way their ancestors treated the false prophets.’

Communion Antiphon

Scriptural Context

Message for all

Throughout the Gospel of Luke, the author is keen to demonstrate that the message of Jesus is for all people – not just the Jews, but for the Gentiles and Pagans as well. We can see this message revealed in the gathering of people who listened to Jesus' sermon on the plain. We're told there were people from all parts of Judea (all Jews) as well as people from the pagan lands of Tyre and Sidon. The first audiences of this gospel would immediately have recognised the significance of people from Tyre and Sidon standing alongside Jews from Judea.

Gospel Reflection

We are perhaps more familiar with the Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew in which the kingdom of heaven is promised to those who are 'blessed' because of their afflictions. Rather than the Sermon on the Mount from the Gospel of Matthew, the Gospel of Luke presents the same event and teaching as the sermon on the plain as it occurs on 'a piece of level ground'. This version may appear a little more confronting than the Matthew version. Rather than the afflicted being 'blessed', they are to be 'happy'. It seems odd that anybody should be happy to be poor, hungry, mourning or reviled and we would certainly regard these as states of sadness and difficulty; not times for rejoicing at our good fortune! However, this gospel in particular frequently reminds us that God does not

think, feel and behave as we might expect. God's actions are frequently contrary to the expectations of society. The Gospel of Luke makes it plain that the reign of God will upend the structures of society. The lowly will be raised and the mighty will be brought low. It is in this context that the poor, the hungry and the outcast are regarded as happy. Their happiness comes from the reassurance that although they are rejected and dismissed by society, they are indeed the most favoured of God. Whatever the world dishes up to such as these, they can rejoice in the knowledge that in the reign of God their fortunes will be reversed and they will be favoured. However, just as the fortunes of the poor and afflicted will be reversed for the better, those who are rich, well fed, happy and well regarded will also have their fortunes reversed. Alas to them! Their comfort and joy leaves no room for the generosity of God!

Pope Francis supports U.S. Bishops in migrant advocacy

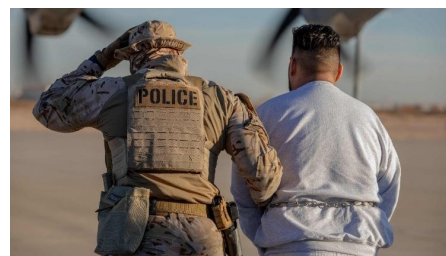
Pope Francis addresses a letter to the bishops of the United States, expressing his support for their efforts to protect the rights and dignity of migrants.

In a letter dated 10 February 2025, and addressed to his brothers in the episcopate, Pope Francis acknowledges the work of U.S. bishops in standing alongside migrants and refugees, he expresses support for efforts to uphold the fundamental dignity of every human person and he highlights the importance of pastoral accompaniment for those facing displacement.

In his letter, the Pope recalls the Holy Family's flight into Egypt and draws a parallel between their experience and that of many migrants today. Their journey, he notes, shines the light on "the phenomenon of migration as a decisive moment in history" and reaffirms "not only our faith in God but also the infinite and transcendent dignity of every human person."

Highlighting Pope Pius XII's apostolic constitution on the Care of Migrants, which describes the Holy Family as a model for all who must leave their homeland in search of safety and stability, he writes "Your work in defending migrants is deeply rooted in the mission of Christ and the history of the Church."



Uphold human dignity

In his 10-point letter, the Holy Father says he has "followed closely the major crisis that is taking place in the United States with the initiation of a program of mass deportations" and commends the bishops' efforts stressing that Christian love demands recognition of the dignity of all people, regardless of legal status. Since taking office on 20 January, President Donald Trump has announced a series of immigration-related executive orders that pave the way for a widespread effort to crack down on undocumented migrants in the US. In more than 21 actions, Trump has moved to overhaul parts of the US immigration system, including how migrants are processed and deported from the US. The Pope acknowledges the complex realities surrounding U.S. migration policies but reminds the bishops that the measure of a just society is how it treats its most vulnerable members. "The legitimate regulation of migration must never undermine the essential dignity of the person," he writes. The Pope also expresses appreciation for the bishops' advocacy against narratives that criminalize migrants and emphasizes their role in ensuring that policies respect human rights. "God will richly reward all that you do for the protection and defence of those who are considered less valuable, less important, or less human," he says.

Strengthening the Church's Mission

In light of the current challenges, Pope Francis urges the bishops to remain steadfast in their work, and despite the obstacles they face, including social and political pressures, he encourages them to continue promoting solidarity and compassion. "Your pastoral ministry is a beacon of hope for many who feel abandoned and excluded," he states. Reaffirming the Church's mission, the Pope calls on the bishops to lead by example in fostering an inclusive and just society. "Through your witness, the faithful are reminded that true Christian identity is expressed in fraternity and the unwavering defence of human dignity," he writes.

Prayer for strength and guidance

Pope Francis concludes his letter entrusting the bishops and the migrants they serve to the protection of Our Lady of Guadalupe: May she "grant us all to meet (...) as brothers and sisters, within her embrace, and thus take a step forward in the construction of a society that is more fraternal, inclusive and respectful of the dignity of all."

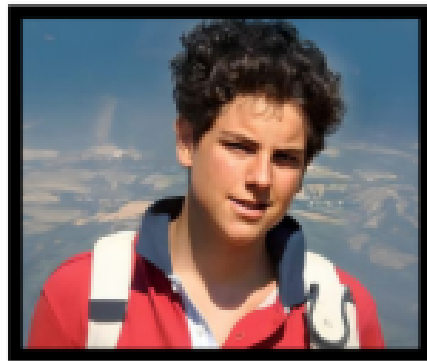

Blessed Carlo Acutis

to be canonised a Saint on April 27th 2025

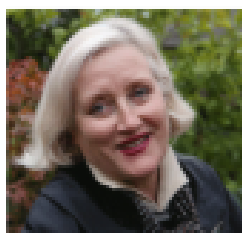


Carlo's Biography:

Born in London, in 1991, Carlo loved football, Pokémon, action films, and all animals (he had four dogs, two cats and many goldfish as pets). But from early childhood, his first love was Our Lord in the Eucharist. Neither of his parents were religious, yet from an early age Carlo never wanted to pass a church without going in to "say hello to Jesus." Because of this his mother came back to faith, then his father. Carlo received his First Holy Communion early, at his own request, in a local convent. His love, appreciation and reverence for the Eucharist were exceptional and he would often say "The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven!" Carlo began visiting Eucharistic miracles all over the world from age 11, and documenting them. A "computer genius," by age fourteen he had created a Eucharistic Miracle display that would tour the world, along with a website. He believed that if people knew that Jesus was truly in the Eucharist, they would turn to God. Carlo hated to be enslaved by anything, so although he loved computer games, he allowed himself to play for only one hour a week, and gave the rest of his time to good works helping children, the elderly, and the poor. He was popular at school, but also befriended children who were unhappy at home, defended the disabled, and treated girls with a respect which challenged everyone. He would defend his Catholic faith – including his pro-life views – fearlessly in class. In early October, 2006, Carlo became ill with flu – so it was thought. He was admitted to hospital, receiving the terrible diagnosis of fulminant leukaemia. The fifteen-year-old boy who loved to laugh had a few days to live. Carlo took the news calmly, immediately offering all his sufferings for the Pope, the Church, and his own direct entry into heaven. "I am happy to die," he said, "because I have lived my life without wasting a minute on those things which do not please God."

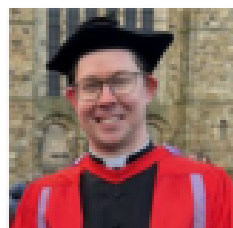
Our Guest Speakers:
