When Jesus received the news of John the Baptist's death he withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and, leaving the towns, went after him on foot. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them and healed their sick.

When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, 'This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.' Jesus replied, 'There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.' But they answered, 'All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.' 'Bring them here to me,' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves he handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining, twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.

Diocese of Sale Pastoral Plan Development Framework.

Thank you so much to everyone who contributed feedback over the last six or seven weeks that will feed into the development of our Parish Pastoral Plan.

As you can imagine, there is a wide range of views and opinions as to what the parish should focus on over the next 5 years. There is a lot of very positive feedback and good ideas. There is also feedback can be seen as conflicting. The Parish Pastoral Plan Development Team is now working to summarise this feedback into a draft Plan. Where there is apparent conflict, the team is determined to work through this feedback in a way that maximises the chances of arriving at BOTH/AND solutions rather than an EITHER/OR solutions. For example; let's say the apparent conflict is Organ music VS Guitar music. The development team will look for a solution which caters to both those who see organ music as important, and those who see guitar music as important, rather than making an EITHER/OR discernment which in the long run may lose us parishioners because the organ people or the guitar people no longer feel heard or included and possibly decide to leave the parish.

The Team is working hard to develop this in a timely manner and is hoping to soon have a draft for consideration by parishioners. Please keep the team in your thoughts and prayers as they seek the Holy Spirit's guidance in their discernment.
